ENERGY SAVING TIPS



TURN DOWN YOUR THERMOSTAT

Find a comfortable temperature and keep it fixed there. Remember to turn it down at night and when you're out. Also consider wearing warm clothing while at home instead of turning up the heat.



OPEN & CLOSE YOUR BLINDS

Make sure your blinds and curtains are open during the day, allowing sunlight into the house. Close blinds at night to trap heat.



WINTERIZE YOUR WINDOWS & DOORS

Use plastic film to cover your windows and make sure they are locked shut. Inspect door frames to make sure no drafts are coming into your home.



CHECK YOUR FURNACE

Clean your air filters so that your heating system works more efficiently.



USE YOUR CEILING FAN

Set your fan to blow air towards the ceiling. This will allow even heating in the room.

CONNECTICUT ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Connecticut's winter heating assistance program pays for most energy sources, including: natural gas, electricity, oil, propane, kerosene, coal, wood, and wood pellets.

The exact level of benefits is based on the number of members in the household, the household's income, and whether it is a "vulnerable" household. Households with a lower income will be eligible for a higher amount of assistance.

ARE YOU A HOMEOWNER OR RENTER WHO PAYS SEPARATELY FOR HEAT?

Vulnerable households (with one or more members who are elderly (age 60 or older) or who have a disability or are under the age of 6) may be eligible for up to \$725 in basic winter heating benefits. Non-Vulnerable households can be eligible up to \$670. Minimum basic benefit level is \$340 for CEAP households.

ARE YOUR HEATING COSTS INCLUDED IN YOUR MONTHLY RENT?

You may still be eligible for up to \$150 to \$190 in winter heating assistance depending on the household's income and number of members. This level applies to households for renters whose heat is included in their rent, and who pay more than 30% of their gross income toward rent.

THE WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

If you qualify for the Energy Assistance Program you may also be eligible for the Weatherization Assistance Program that will help conserve energy and lower your household heating bills. This program helps low-income persons minimize energy-related costs and fuel usage in their homes through retrofits and home improvement measures.

Currently, eligibility is set at 60% of state median income. Priority is given to households with members that are particularly vulnerable, such as the elderly, those with disabilities, families with children and high energy users. For multi-family dwellings, at least two-thirds of the tenants must be income-eligible.

If you are not eligible for the program, there are other programs available including a utility ratepayer-funded lowcost energy audit. Contact your utility company to learn more.
