## STATE VETERANS BENEFITS

**Tuition Waivers** are available for veterans accepted for undergraduate and graduate coursework at Connecticut State Universities, UConn, and the 12 Community Technical Colleges. National Guard members, dependent children and spouses of veterans who died in action may also qualify. Contact me for a brochure or call the Department of Higher Education at 1-800-842-0229.

### Department of Motor Vehicles Fee Exemptions

Active duty personnel and veterans who received an honorable discharge within the previous two years are eligible for a waiver of the motor vehicle license and registration fees. Be sure to fill out the waiver application, Form B-276, available on the DMV website. **Call:** 1-800-842-8222 or **Visit:** [www.ct.gov/dmv](http://www.ct.gov/dmv).

**Gold Star Family License Plates** are available to the immediate relatives of state residents killed in active military duty. Call the Department of Motor Vehicles at: 1-800-842-8222 or access the application online at [www.ct.gov/dmv](http://www.ct.gov/dmv).



A **Veterans' Registry** is now maintained by the State Department of Veterans Affairs as a means of informing veterans of new benefits and services available to them. Contact me for the registration form so you may add your name to the list.

**Connecticut's Wartime Service Medal** was established by the General Assembly to honor our veterans for their extraordinary contributions. In order to qualify, a veteran must have performed 90 days of wartime service, be a current Connecticut resident or a resident during his period of wartime service, and have been honorably discharged.
