By passing our fiscal stabilization plan we protected the largest and second-largest tax cuts in state history and ensured more retirement income would be tax-exempt. We also filled our priority buckets by increasing funding for higher education, early childhood, mental health, and nonprofits.

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MAKING CT SENIORS A PRIORITY

- Expedited Medicaid coverage for home-based care as an alternative to more costly nursing home care
- Required home care workers to wear photo-ID badges
- Created a new registry system to connect patients to home care providers and created a dashboard to help navigate nursing home options
- Prevented nursing homes from putting more than two patients in a single room
- Required nursing homes and retirement communities to provide at least 60-90 days' notice of any fee increases and improved transparency around fees
- Created an incentive-based program to improve nursing home care in CT
- Fast-tracked nursing home transfers and receiverships when homes are closing
- Required health insurance coverage for detecting coronary artery disease
- Strengthened oversight of negligent nursing homes

DEBATING BIG ISSUES

The House took up major policy initiatives like eldercare, childcare and early child education, childhood nutrition, the climate crisis, paid time off for workers, street takeovers, and protecting health workers and more:

- Cut certification red tape to make licensing faster and enable teachers to teach more subjects across more arades
- Expanded eligibility in the fast-track certification program
- Made it easier for industry experts to teach in our tech schools

Supported middle-class and working families by granting most full and part-time workers access to Paid Sick Days over a three-year period:

- Use for yourself or to care for a loved one
- Up to 40 hours per year
- Roll over time to the following year
