KEEPING PEOPLE IN THEIR HOMES

As Connecticut navigates the housing crisis that affects the entire country, the General Assembly is poised to extend the state’s mortgage foreclosure mediation process two more years and offer homeowners facing foreclosure the chance for mediation before any legal action is taken. Giving homeowners and their families a second chance to stay in their homes is critical to preserving neighborhoods and our community.

EMPOWERING PUBLIC HOUSING TENANTS

Legislation I recently shepherded through the House would allow tenants of a public housing facility the ability to elect the tenant commissioner representative on their housing authority board. Right now, the position is appointed by the municipality. The tenant commissioner would have full voting rights and will best represent the interests of the tenants.

REACHING OUT WITH HEALTH SERVICES

The 4th annual Mission of Mercy free dental clinic in Waterbury attracted 2,000 people who required dental services, but lack dental services or are underinsured. I am proud to have volunteered and support this important program. People began lining up for the clinic in the wee hours of the morning, which demonstrates the need for these services. It’s estimated that between 600,000 and 1 million Connecticut residents lack dental insurance.
