MAJOR WINS FOR STAMFORD

STRENGTHENED HOMEOWNER RIGHTS:

- Prevented people from being foreclosed on for small, missed sewer payments.
- Increased the reimbursement homebuyers get when their contractor goes bankrupt and cannot repay them.
- Prevented condo associations from prohibiting homeowners from installing solar panels on their detached homes.

SUPPORTED OUR SENIORS:

- Ensured insurance coverage of biomarker testing to detect cancer early and improve treatment.
- Provided free online college courses to our nursing home residents.
- Created anti-discrimination protections for residents of longterm care facilities and now require their staff to receive antidiscrimination training.

HELPING OUR WORKING AND MIDDLE CLASS FAMILIES:

- Helped first-time homebuyers save money through new tax-free savings accounts.
- Banned landlords from using your private data to set higher rent prices.
- Ensured access to fair rent commissions to curb egregious rent hikes.
- Made it easier for contractors to bring on an apprentice.
- Made it easier for out-of-state CPAs to relocate to CT.
- Made it easier for out-of-state marriage and family therapists to relocate to CT.

A BALANCED BUDGET

EQUITABLE APPROACH

TO STATE TAXES

Thanks to sound budgeting and the leadership of Democrats in the state legislature we:

- Provided Medicaid increases for providers and increased funding for Federally Qualified Health Centers for the first time in years.
- Increased rates will reach 17 providers located in 250 facilities in communities around our state who serve over 440,000 of our residents.

We delivered targeted, meaningful relief and long-term support for working families through fairer tax policies:

- Established an Enhanced Tax Credit for Families: We created a refundable tax credit of \$250 per filer through the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) framework— helping working families keep more of what they earn.
- Supported Childcare Providers: We created a \$500 refundable tax credit for home daycare owners.
- Helped Families Save For College: We launched a tax credit for employers who contribute to their employees' CHET accounts.



CUTTING YOUR ELECTRIC BILL, NOT YOUR POWER

- Our comprehensive reforms deliver \$780 million in savings over the next few years.
- Moved programmatic charges out of your bill and created better oversight of new charges.
- Capped infrastructure programs that utility companies make us pay for while they profit off the interest.
- Removed industry subsidies from our clean energy investments.

EDUCATION IS A TOP PRIORITY

INVESTING IN EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE AND EDUCATION:

- We established the Early Childhood Education Endowment with a down payment of nearly \$300 million.
- By 2027, families earning up to \$100,000 will be able to receive childcare at no cost, while families earning more will pay no more than 7% of their income for childcare.
- We authorized \$80 million to help childcare providers expand and upgrade their facilities.

KEEPING OUR COLLEGE GRADS IN CT:

- We created the new "finish line" scholarship program to help students attending free community college to finish their bachelor's degree.
- Increased funding for merit- and need-based scholarships at private colleges.
- Made it easier for college graduates to qualify for state loan forgiveness programs.
