



Millions For Griffin Hospital:

Democrats in the state House and Senate voted to restore **\$3.5 million** to Griffin Hospital.

On September 23, I pledged to fight Governor Malloy’s cuts to Griffin Hospital; in October we secured funding for small hospitals; and now the legislature has approved a budget reform package that restores most of the cuts.

Timeline:

- In June, Democrats approved a state budget that included \$4.8 million for Griffin Hospital.
- In September, Governor Dannel Malloy unveiled a package of budget rescissions that included up to \$84 million in cuts to hospitals and reduced Griffin’s state funding to \$1.2 million.
- I worked to ease the impact to Griffin Hospital and by early October, Governor Malloy agreed to restore \$14.1 million to the state’s small hospitals.
- In December, Democrats approved a bill that restored state funding for Griffin to \$4.72 million.

VALLEY UPDATE

State Funds for Seymour Fields:

I worked directly with the Governor’s Office and Speaker of the House to secure state funding for Seymour athletic fields.

- \$265,000 for the softball field.
- \$1.895 million for the football field.

Valley Delegation Welcomes State Bonding Award For Inter-Town Capital Equipment:

The Valley is on the cutting edge of regionalism and was rewarded with state funds for the purchase of shared equipment. A grant of \$264,939 helped purchase a food service truck and a storm drain vacuum.

Grant For Beacon Falls:

Beacon Falls received a \$199,500 small town grant to repair road damage from flooding due to a lack of adequate drainage on Highland Avenue.

State Funds For Downtown Derby:

Great news for Derby. The state Bond Commission approved \$445,000 for downtown revitalization. The goal is to make downtown Derby more pedestrian-friendly.

CONROY LEADS PASSAGE OF LEGISLATION TO CURB OPIOID ABUSE

- The opioid epidemic is a public health crisis.
- The legislation improves the monitoring and reporting of narcotic prescriptions by prescribers and pharmacists, and increases access to life-saving opioid antagonists.

GOVERNMENT EFFICIENCY THROUGH REGIONALISM

Speaker Brendan Sharkey originally founded the MORE (Municipal Opportunities & Regional Efficiencies) Commission in 2010. He has asked Rep. Theresa Conroy to serve on the bipartisan Regional Entities sub-committee and Municipal Efficiencies sub-committee where she will explore cost efficiency through regional collaboration and ways to regionalize some of the functions of local government and other entities.
