Veteran Status On Licenses

Your Connecticut driver's license or state identity card can now display veteran status. Having a standard ID with a veterans' designation will provide easier proof of eligibility for benefit programs and access to store discounts. To obtain this distinction, you will need to bring records of your service at the time of license renewal.

Free Passes For State Parks

Connecticut residents who are disabled wartime veterans can now get a free, lifetime pass for state parks, forests, and recreational facilities in Connecticut. The pass allows free parking, admission, and boat access parking.

Property Tax Interest Waiver

The property tax interest waiver, previously applied to only those in active service in Iraq, has been expanded to include those in active service in Afghanistan.

Veteran License Plates

Active members of the armed forces and National Guard can now obtain "veteran" designated license plates. Previously, only retired members were issued these plates.
