UNIVERSITY REMOVES PROPERTIES FROM TOWN TAX ROLL

Quinnipiac has been on a buying binge of single-family residences in the middle of Hamden neighborhoods. In fact, Mr. Lahey said in the party video, "I didn't even know this street existed. I'm going to have to buy all these houses. I've got all of New Road and most of Whitney Avenue but I didn't realize you're kind of tucked away back here." As a non-profit, Quinnipiac doesn't pay property taxes for single family residential homes bought to house students. Yet, they use many of our town's services, including police, fire, and public works.

COLLEGES WOULD PAY PROPERTY TAXES ON HOMES UNDER BILL

We have a bill (HB 6965) in the legislature, which would ask private colleges, like Quinnipiac, to pay their fair share, just like every other member of our community, on residential property (houses) that they own. This is common sense legislation that will help protect the families, neighborhoods, and communities of Hamden. It deserves to pass now.
