

GROWING STAMFORD'S ECONOMY

- Lowered the business tax rate for unemployment insurance

MEANINGFUL INVESTMENTS IN STUDENTS, TEACHERS AND SCHOOLS

- I worked to help make sure that our state government pays for 60% of all Stamford School construction over the next 25 years
- Expanded the debt-free community college program
- Established student loan reimbursement program
- Extended the renewal time for teaching certificates
- Ensured more districts will meet eligibility requirements for the federal School Breakfast Program
- Established a new reimbursement grant to assist schools in upgrading their systems, and ensured regular inspections and reporting on their operation

SUPPORTING VETERANS AND FIRST RESPONDERS

- Guaranteed CT veterans in-state tuition rates
- Adopted higher department equipment standards, collecting better data on the prevalence of cancer among firefighters, and secured more local funding for firefighters who leave service with a cancer diagnosis
- Provided funding to local volunteer fire departments who respond to emergencies on certain state highways
- Expanded special relief funding for front line workers who had to work during COVID

- Increased health care coverage to undocumented immigrants for children 12 and under
- Expanded minority teacher scholarships
- Created a Hate Crimes Investigation Unit within the State Police
- Required towns with over 25,000 residents to establish a local fair rent commission.
- Limited the use of solitary confinement
- Increased business development funding for minority-owned businesses
- Honored our commitment to body cameras, police accountability and our new clean slate laws
- Improved police training for handling incidents involving individuals with mental or physical disabilities
