2022 SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

- Increasing ECS Funding for Waterbury Schools
- Cutting Taxes to Combat Historic Inflation
- Lowering Car Tax Cap to 32.46 Mills
- Creating Environmentally Conscious Initiatives
- Maintaining CT's Future Fiscal Integrity

OUR STATE BUDGET INCLUDES

\$650 MILLION IN TAX RELIEF

- ✔️ Creates a Child Tax Credit
- ✔️ Expands the property tax credit
- ✔️ Cuts the car tax
- ✔️ Extends the gas tax cut
- ✔️ Extends free bus service
- ✔️ Ends pension and annuity tax
- ✔️ Invests in healthcare workers



STANDING UP FOR WORKERS

- Toughened the penalty for public contractors who underpay or withhold wages and benefits, created a public registry of those individuals, and established a process for revoking the licenses of repeat offenders (PA 22-17)
- Helped front-line, private sector workers access premium pay, if they were certain essential employees who had to work through the pandemic (PA 22-118)
- Expanded access to special relief funding for specific front-line workers who had to work during COVID and got sick as a result (PA 22-118)



SERVING THOSE WHO SERVED US

- Adopted higher fire department equipment standards, collecting better data on the prevalence of cancer among firefighters, and secured more local funding for firefighters who leave service with a cancer diagnosis (PA 22-139)
- Extended employment protections to police officers who seek and receive mental health care services. (PA 22-64)
- Established a new, local-option property tax exemption equal to 10% of home values for more veterans (PA 22-34)
- Guaranteed CT veterans in-state tuition rates (PA 22-41)



ADDRESSING CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH

- Provided grants to local schools to hire more support staff in the areas of mental health: social workers, psychologists, and counselors
- Expanded 24/7 emergency mental health response
- Assisted local schools in expanding mental health staff and access to care
- Provided mental health training to parents, students, and pediatricians
- Established state oversight and coordination of the state response to kids' mental health needs. (PA 22-47, 22-80)
