PROTECTING TAX CUTS

WE PROTECTED A BIPARTISAN BIENNIUM BUDGET THAT INCLUDES HISTORIC TAX CUTS AND INVESTMENTS FOR OUR COMMUNITY.

- LARGEST INCOME TAX CUT in state history
- Exempted even more retirement income from state taxes
- Record Rainy Day Fund
- Paid down generations of pension debt
- Biggest investment in public education ever
- Expansion of debt free community college

THIS SESSION WE PROTECTED THESE TAX CUTS AND INVESTED MILLIONS OF FEDERAL FUNDS IN:

- Mental Health \$24 million (Including Children's Mental Health, a top priority of mine that I fought for as Appropriations Committee vice chair)
- Early Childcare \$21.8 million
- Nonprofits that provide valuable state services \$50 million
- Higher Education \$160 million

FUNDING FOR THE 19TH DISTRICT

West Hartford and Avon are expected to receive a total of over **\$70** million in state aid for FY 24 and FY 25. This is an increase of over **\$6.6** million to help fund our schools and roads.

- West Hartford was allocated funding for its Vision Zero Action Plan for pedestrian and traffic safety
- Avon was approved to receive funding for improvements to the Farmington Canal Heritage Trail

FOCUS ON MENTAL HEALTH

This session, a top priority of mine was following through on my promise toward addressing <u>Children's Behavioral Health</u> and implementation of HB 5001. I chaired the committee, and co-authored the legislation, that created the transformative mental health law in 2022. As a result, we are dedicating <u>\$10 million</u> from the Federal ARPA funding bill we passed to go toward services and our continued work through the Transforming Children's Behavioral (TCB) Health Policy and Planning Committee.

CORONARY CALCIUM SCANS

While I'd never heard of a coronary calcium scan prior to my husband's death, I am now aware of it and how it can save lives. I never want anyone to experience what my family and I are going through, so I feel that it's important to **share, inform and educate about Coronary Calcium Scans**. I provided testimony and I am proud to have been a lead co-sponsor in support of SB 1, our major healthcare reform bill. There is a provision I endorsed that requires certain insurance policies to cover coronary calcium scans, which is a quick scan of the heart that looks for calcium deposits in the arteries. After the sudden and tragic passing of my husband Earl, it was discovered by a medical examiner that a coronary calcium scan could have helped to save his life. The importance of this bill helps patients understand the existence of this test and now also provides insurance coverage, which **can and will save lives**.









EDUCATION

- Cut certification red tape to make licensing faster, and allowed teachers to teach more subjects across more grades
- Created the Early Childhood Care and Education Fund to maximize public and private investments
- Invested in teachers, assistant teachers, and paraeducators in state-funded school readiness programs and childcare programs

SENIORS

- Made it easier for seniors to age in place, increased communitybased services, and grants to assist seniors with home repairs
- Created a nursing home database to connect seniors with quality care
- Established oversight to prevent abuse and provided for nursing homes to improve care

LEGISLATIVE NEWSBRIEFS

<u>Veterans</u> - Exempted permanently and totally disabled veterans from paying property taxes

<u>Environment</u> - Banned numerous products containing dangerous PFAS chemicals

<u>Health and Wellness</u> - Made permanent access and coverage to telehealth that was scheduled to sunset June 30, 2024

<u>Public Safety</u> - Authorized permanent use of automated enforcement devices to enhance road safety and established vehicle noise limits with fines for violations

<u>Higher Education</u> - Expanded employer-based student loan repayment tax credits and reduced rates for state-backed loans for in-demand occupations
