HEATING AND ENERGY ASSISTANCE

CONNECTICUT ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

- This is heating assistance for households whose income falls at or below 60% of the state median income.
- Email crtenergyapplication@crtct.org or call at 860-560-5800 to apply and receive more information about eligibility.

OPERATION FUEL

- Utility assistance for households whose income falls at or below 75% of the state median income.
- Must have been denied support or have exhausted resources from state-administered heating assistance (CEAP) before applying.
- Check eligibility and apply by calling 211 or by visiting operationfuel.org/gethelp/fuel-bank-finder

NEW LAW PROTECTING YOU

Energy customers will now receive compensation to help with the impacts of major power outages:

- \$25 credit for each 24-hour period after the first 96 hours of a power outage.
- \$250 compensation for medication and food that has expired during a power outage lasting more than 96 hours.

ADDITIONAL RESOURCES

- UniteCT can provide up to \$1500 in heating assistance to renters behind on payments due to COVID and are below 80% of the area median income. Apply at portal. ct.gov/DOH/DOH/Programs/UniteCT
