The 2025 legislative session featured big issues like lowering energy bills, childcare, special education and the state budget – and we tackled them all.

Our budget provides a \$250 check to working families under EITC guidelines and \$300 million to fund the childcare trust fund. We devoted hundreds of millions of dollars to special education and we approved comprehensive energy legislation to reduce electric bills for businesses and families.

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BIG WINS FOR BRIDGEPORT

- Cut Your Electric Bill

SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES

In the 2025 Session I introduced a bill that would establish a State Child Tax Credit for our working families that provided a benefit per child. While we are still fighting for a full Child Tax Credit in the legislature we were able to deliver relief to those families in the form of Earned income tax credit expansion. Starting with next year's taxes families eligible for the EITC that have children will get a credit of \$250 to help with family expenses.

While more relief is sorely needed, I recognize the plight that our residents face raising children in the current economy and policy like this is an acknowledgment that action must be taken to ease the burden.



EDUCATION RELIEF IN BRIDGEPORT

This session the Bridgeport Delegation secured \$74M for a Special Education Center for Bridgeport Public Schools. Special Education services are critical to a successful school district and having a facility dedicated to those needs allows us to compile resources and reduce costs.

The delegation also ensured an audit of district finances to ensure BPS Central Office and the Board of Education are best equipped to use funds that are available. The need for more funding is evident and I have fought incredibly hard as your representative to increase state funding for our education system. As the fight continues this audit will equip us with the tools necessary to give targeted financial support to the district.
