When will I be able to receive a COVID-19 Vaccine?

Everyone over the age of 12 is now eligible to receive a vaccine. Additionally, there are walk-ins and mobile clinics available throughout Danbury. For information go to ct.gov/covidvaccine/access.

Are you struggling to schedule a vaccine appointment online and find transportation?

Call the Vaccination Appointment Assistance Line (VAAL) at 1-877-918-2224 to schedule an appointment at participating vaccine providers.

Can I still get COVID-19 after I'm vaccinated?

It typically takes a few weeks for the body to build immunity after full vaccination. Although it is possible to get COVID-19 after receiving the vaccine, your chances of becoming fatally sick drop significantly.
