New Laws Responding to COVID

- Continued coverage and access to telehealth, allowing you to do simple check ups virtually from home
- Ensured access to virtual visits and monitoring for nursing home residents
- Reformed nursing home staffing, policies, supply inventories
- Expanded worker's comp benefits for PTSD to cover pandemic frontline workers
- Increased state funding to the Danbury Health Department from \$90,531 to \$163,459 in the next two fiscal years
- Provided certain low-wage workers who were laid off during the pandemic first dibs on getting their jobs back
