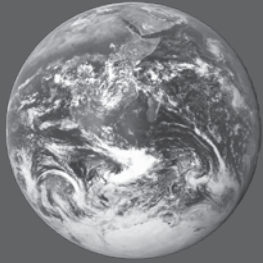

- HB 5921: An Act Concerning Funding For The Connecticut Green Bank And Incentives For Solar Installations For Certain Communities And Households
- HB 5945: An Act Concerning Community Choice Aggregation
- HB 6089: An Act Reducing Barriers To Food Security
- I am also championing the strengthening of our Environmental Justice Law around permitting reform for polluters, as well as neonicotinoid pesticides and rodenticide reform to halt the damage to biodiversity, pollinators, and our ecosystem
