

ADDITIONAL RECYCLING FOR DROP OFF

BOOKS/DVDs/VHS TAPES & CASSETTES

All soft and hardcover books as well as DVDs, VHS tapes and cassettes may now be recycled. A collection container is located at the Transfer Station (Rte. 83). Permit and punch card not required.

CLOTHING/SHOES

The “kiducation” containers are located in front of the Public Works Garages at 375 Hartford Turnpike (Rte. 30) and at the Transfer Station (Rte. 83).



TELEPHONE BOOKS

SBC/SNET PHONE BOOKS

Recycling containers are located in front of the Public Works Garage at 375 Hartford Turnpike (Rte. 30).



REMINDER PHONE BOOKS

Drop off at Reminder Press, Old Town Road, Vernon.

OUR TOWN RECYCLES

To help keep our environment clean, the Town of Vernon has a required curbside recycling program. One orange bin is issued per family unit in which to place recyclables for weekly pickup. Recycle bins are available at the Public Works Department at 375 Hartford Turnpike.

Pick up detailed refuse and recycling brochures at the Vernon Town Hall, the Public Works office or the Transfer Station off Rte. 83. For specific questions or additional information, contact the Public Works Department office at 870-3500.

HERE'S WHAT VERNON ACCEPTS FOR RECYCLING

FOOD & BEVERAGE

ALUMINUM BEVERAGE CONTAINERS

Examples: Soda/beer cans. Rinse clean. Do not flatten or crush.

ALUMINUM FOIL

Examples: Aluminum foil wrap, take-out aluminum foil food containers. Rinse clean and fold flat.

ASEPTIC PACKAGING

Examples: Milk and juice cartons, small single-serve milk and juice boxes, up to 3 liters or 1 gallon in size with straws and plastic spout caps removed. Do not flatten or crush cartons.



GLASS FOOD & DRINK

Examples: Soda, liquor, wine and juice bottles, jelly jars in clear, brown and green bottles, rinsed clean. Lids, caps, broken glass or dishes should go in the trash.

METAL FOOD & DRINK

Examples: Soup, vegetable, juice, cookie tins, pet food cans, bulk size vegetable containers, rinsed clean. Clean metal lids and No. 10 size cans are acceptable.



PLASTIC

PLASTIC CONTAINERS - PET & HDPE

(Coded with "1" or "2" on the bottom)

Examples: Water bottles, soda, juice, dish detergent bottles, rinsed clean. Discard caps and lids in the trash.



Note: Containers previously containing hazardous materials are unacceptable (no empty motor oil containers).

NEWSPAPERS, MAGAZINES & CATALOGS

Tie securely with string or place in brown paper bag (plastic bags are NOT acceptable). Unshredded junk mail can be tied or bagged with newspapers for pickup as there is no need to separate unshredded junk mail from newspapers.



OFFICE PAPER & JUNK MAIL

OFFICE PAPER

Examples: White and colored paper, note pad paper (no backing), loose leaf, computer paper (continuous-form perforated white bond or green-bar paper).

JUNK MAIL

Examples: Catalogs, flyers, brochures, envelopes and envelopes with windows.

UNSHREDDDED OFFICE PAPER & JUNK MAIL

Can be tied or bagged with newspapers.

SHREDDDED OFFICE PAPER & JUNK MAIL

Place shredded paper separately from newspaper in a brown paper bag (plastic bags are NOT acceptable). Staple or tape shut to ensure all shredded materials are contained in the bag.

Note: Large quantities may be brought directly to Transfer Station (no permit or punch card required). Brown paper bags are available at local grocers upon request.

BOXBOARD & CARDBOARD

BOXBOARD

Examples: Cereal boxes, cracker boxes, shoe boxes, beer cartons, and six pack holders that are unwaxed and not plastic coated. Dry food and cereal boxes must have inside bag removed. Boxboard contaminated by food is not acceptable.

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD (Tied & Bundled)

Examples: Kraft paper shipping boxes, cut or folded to a maximum size of 18"x24". Bundle and tie to a maximum height of 12". No wax or plastic coated cardboard.
