Working as your state representative in Hartford is an immense privilege, and I am pleased with the results we delivered for Norwalk and Westport.

Our priorities this session emphasized the value of our residents and the hopes we have for Connecticut's future. Throughout the signature acts was an emphasis on senior citizens, healthcare, the environment, early learning, and childcare. We accomplished these victories working with advocates, agencies, and across the aisle to represent the interests of all viewpoints.

A key piece of legislation leveraged federal ARPA funds for unprecedented investment in major areas: higher education, childcare, mental health, and nonprofits. Additionally, we closed this fiscal year with a \$270 million operating surplus after depositing \$1.1 billion in the Rainy Day Fund and our pension systems. Connecticut continues to critically invest in common goods while retaining the largest tax cuts in state history.


