Attended the groundbreaking of Wilson Park for which I secured a four million dollar state grant.




Attended Young Elected Officials conference in DC to learn from great minds and collaborate with other young elected officials across the country.

## ASSISTANCE WITH PAYING YOUR ELECTRIC BILL

### Flexible Payment Program

Up to 18 months assistance available to help residential customers with active accounts pay off money owed, regardless of income.

### Matching Payment Program (MPP)

Can lower the amount owed on energy bills. For every dollar you pay and every dollar you receive from the Connecticut Energy Assistance Program, we will subtract a dollar from the amount you owe.

### Low-Income Discount Rate

Starting December 1, a new electric bill discount will be available if you have a financial hardship status on your electric account.

## HEATING ASSISTANCE

### Connecticut Energy Assistance Program (CEAP)

Can provide a basic benefit to help pay your heating bill. Apply online at [CT.gov/heatinghelp](http://CT.gov/heatinghelp) or visit your local Community Action Agency.

### Operation Fuel

Provides cash assistance for heating and non-heating expenses for households with incomes at or below 100% of the State Median Income guidelines. Apply at [operationfuel.org/gethelp](http://operationfuel.org/gethelp)
