


ENERGY SAVING TIPS TO SAVE YOU MONEY



INSTALL A PROGRAMMABLE THERMOSTAT

Households can spend up to 50% of their energy costs heating and cooling empty homes. A programmable thermostat can help cut costs.



OPEN & CLOSE YOUR BLINDS

Make sure your blinds and curtains are open during the day, allowing sunlight into the house. Close blinds at night in order to trap heat.



WINTERIZE YOUR WINDOWS & DOORS

Energize CT reports that "sealing air leaks and adding insulation could cut your energy bill by 5 - 30%".




CHECK YOUR FURNACE

CONTACT YOUR UTILITY COMPANY



GET A HOME ENERGY AUDIT



HOME ENERGY SOLUTIONS PROGRAM

Energize CT's Home Energy Solutions program is available to all Eversource residential customers. This program provides both an **energy audit** and **on site services**, such as installation of energy-efficient lighting, faucet aerators and low-flow showerheads. Free service is available to income eligible households.

The certified technicians who visit your home will seal leaks and replace incandescent bulbs, as well as provide personalized payback calculations, information on available rebates, and financing options.

For those who have already completed their home energy audit, Home Performance with Energy Star™ is available for home improvement projects.

CONNECTICUT ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Connecticut's winter heating assistance program for low-income households pays for most heating sources, including: natural gas, electricity, oil, propane, kerosene, coal, wood and wood pellets.

The exact level of benefits is based on the number of members in the household, the household's income, and whether it is a "vulnerable" household. Households with a lower income will be eligible for a higher amount of assistance.
