In an effort to allow more seniors to remain independent in their own homes rather than nursing homes, I will continue supporting legislation which expands access to affordable homecare support and personal care assistance services. HELPING WITH GROCERY BILLS

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), the old Food Stamp program, has expanded its income requirements and benefit amounts, making it easier for more seniors to qualify for and afford their groceries. LOWERING ELECTRIC BILLS

Connecticut businesses and residents pay some of the highest energy rates in the country—15 percent higher than nearby states. Last year, I endorsed an energy bill requiring the state Department of Public Utility Control to reduce energy costs by 15 percent for homeowners and businesses, but Governor Rell vetoed it. This year, we are working with Governor Malloy to reduce energy costs for everyone and give businesses additional capital that can be used to create and expand jobs.
