

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

While the 2024 legislative session was a short one, I am proud of how much we accomplished for Fairfield and Connecticut. My goal for the session was to ensure we invested in our priorities while preserving tax cuts for families and seniors. By passing our fiscal stabilization plan we protected the <u>largest tax</u> cuts in state history and ensured more retirement income will be tax exempt. We also filled our priority buckets by <u>increasing funding for higher education</u>, early childhood, mental health, and nonprofits.

In addition, we had some major successes this session such as <u>Siting Council</u> reform, preventing unnecessary school redistricting by halting the racial imbalance law, and the <u>most significant 8-30g reform</u> since the law's inception that will credit work Fairfield has already done.

However, we also had some heartbreaks, as the Senate never passed our major climate change legislation or my lactation consultant licensure bill that would have supported new mothers. While this is extremely disappointing, I remain resolved and determined to work on these issues, and many others, in the future.

It remains an honor and a privilege to serve you as your state representative for the 132nd District. Thank you for the faith you have put in me to continue to fight for you. As our world and politics continue to feel dark and divided, I remain deeply committed to listening to you, engaging with you, and bringing our community together. ### **FUNDING FOR FAIRFIELD**

From our 2-year state budget, Fairfield will receive a total of \$15.1 million in state aid for FY 24 and FY 25. That includes \$2.25 million in Education Cost Sharing (ECS) funding and \$9.4 million for Tiered Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) that we fought for increases in.

Fairfield will receive over \$1.2 million in state bonding to repair the Lower Wharf in Southport for the repair and replacement of a public pier destroyed by a storm in December 2022.

Fairfield School district will receive \$2 million for the Clean School Bus rebate program to go towards the purchase of 10 new school buses that keep our air clean for our students and community.

The town received \$3 million for transit-oriented mixed-use development and brownfield remediation of the vacant former Bullard Machine Tool Co. site on Black Rock Turnpike.

### **MAJOR WINS FOR FAIRFIELD**

- Paused implementation of the school redistricting law preventing needless redistricting of our local schools.
- Passed the most significant 8-30g statute reform since the law's inception. The change in law will give Fairfield credit for middle housing zones it already has and will now get credit towards its moratorium.
- Reformed the CT Siting Council to ensure the independence of council members from utilities, improves public notice, ensures affected municipalities have automatic intervenor status, and requires utilities submit robust financial analysis for proposal and alternatives.

#### **EDUCATION**

As vice chair of the Education Committee, I am very proud to have helped champion the following initiatives:

- **Cut red tape** to make certification of teachers faster and more flexible
- Created the Early Childhood Care and Education Fund to <u>maximize</u> <u>public and private investments</u>
- Invested in teachers, assistant teachers, paraeducators, and state-funded school readiness programs and childcare programs

#### **ENVIRONMENT**

As a new member of the Environment Committee, I was glad to work on many bills and remain committed to passing the Climate Change bill that died in the Senate:

- Banned numerous products containing dangerous PFAS chemicals
- $\checkmark$ Expedited permitting for solar and lifted caps on new solar production

#### ECONOMY

As co-chair of the Main Street Working Group I was proud to support the following bills to promote business:

- **Expanded the small business loan program** and enabled more out-of-state businesses to expand into CT
- Created a fund to improve and manage our small harbors
