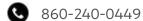

Support Services for Families

Helping a loved one struggling with addiction can sometimes seem like a full-time job and often leads to personal and physical stress. For families seeking support The Connecticut Clearinghouse (www.ctclearinghouse.org) provides a directory of self-help and support groups here: bit.ly/2dVTIBR

If your loved one is abusing prescription drugs or heroin and is ready to seek help, start by calling your local Regional Mental Health Board (portal.ct.gov/DMHAS/ Commissions-Councils-Boards/Index/Regional-Behavioral-Health-Action-Organizations-RBHAOs). You can find your region and contact information here: portal.ct.gov/DMHAS/Programs-and-Services/Finding-Services/Finding-Services. The staff and volunteers on these boards are dedicated to improving the quality of life for individuals who need support in their recovery and often know the best local resources currently available in terms of treatment. In addition to the Regional Mental Health Boards, you can also call the state's Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services' (portal.ct.gov/ dmhas) (DMHAS) 24-hour hotline at 1-800-563-4086. The person on the other end of this number will direct those seeking treatment and services for an opioid addiction to a local walk-in assessment center in your area.
