


















SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL REGIONS





Each party to the Agreement waives all claims against the other parties for compensation for any loss, damage, personal injury, or death occurring as a consequence of the performance of this Agreement, except in cases of willful and wanton misconduct, gross negligence, or bad faith of any officer, employee, or agent of another party to this Agreement.
- 9. This Agreement remains in full force and effect from the date herein above written unless sooner terminated by any of the parties giving to the others thirty (30) days written notice of such termination. This Agreement may be amended by the mutual written consent of the parties.
- Nothing herein supersedes or replaces any existing mutual aid agreements between the parties to this Agreement.
