VOTING AND TRANSPARENCY

- Developed guidelines for the implementation of early voting in 2024
- Approved no excuse absentee voting for placement on the 2024 ballot
- Adopted a Voting Rights Act to prevent voter discrimination






HELPING FAMILIES

- Addressed housing affordability and promoted homeownership
- Expanded assistance and health care coverage to refugees
- Created Student Loan Forgiveness and lower refinancing rates to support workforce development
- Launched Baby Bonds, which invests \$3,200 for every child who is born after July 1, 2023 and is eligible for the state's Medicaid program
- Expanded funding for Meals on Wheels and adult day services

KEEPING COMMUNITIES SAFE

- Strengthened gun violence prevention measures and funded \$3.9 million for Public Health's Gun Violence Prevention initiatives
- Required local traffic authorities to be trained in best practices
- Increased initiatives to eliminate traffic fatalities and injuries through infrastructure, enhanced enforcement and public awareness
- Ended child marriage for residents under age 18
- Created more stringent standards for targeted advertising to kids and formed a police task force to address abuse of children online

HEALTH AND WELLNESS

- Serving in my first year as co-chair of the Public Health Committee, I was proud to help lead the efforts which:
- Created a drug discount card for all residents
- Reduced facility fees charged by hospital systems
- Improved infant and maternal healthcare, including home visits for new mothers
- Protected access to reproductive healthcare by protecting providers from retribution
- Directed Tobacco Settlement funds to include vaping prevention
- Established a harm reduction center pilot program to reduce opioid deaths
- Assured evidence based, effective use of Opioid Settlement Funds by the state and municipalities
- Improved staffing ratio decisions and safety conditions for hospital

Increased opportunities for early detection screening for lung cancer

- This year's most significant local investments include:
- \$3.5 million for Bridgeport Public Schools
- \$350K for the Fairfield Senior Center
- \$2.5 million approved for Fairfield Rooster River flood mitigation
- \$42 million allocated for Bridgeport's Ox Brook and Rooster

• \$15 million approved for the Total Mortgage Arena in Bridgeport • \$117 million in retirement plan savings for the city of Bridgeport • \$6.2 million for HVAC investments and air quality improvements for Fairfield Public Schools
