The 2025 legislative session featured big issues like lowering energy bills, childcare, special education and the state budget – and we tackled them all.

AN EQUITABLE APPROACH TO STATE TAXES

- Created a refundable tax credit of \$250 per filer through the Earned Income Tax Credit framework - helping working families keep more of what they earn.
- Created a \$500 refundable tax credit for home daycare owners - recognizing and sustaining the vital care workforce that allows families to work.
- Closed a major loophole for big multi-state corporations by ending a tax break that kept them from paying their share of taxes, which gave them a competitive advantage over our local businesses.

PROTECTING OUR CHILDREN

- Increased fines for anyone who gives a vape to kids and strengthened penalties for stores that sell cannabis to a minor.
- Made it easier for kids who age out of foster care to access services, including special education programs.
- Stopped the practice of handcuffing kids under 14.
- Made it easier for schools to buy new response systems to instantly contact first responders and save lives.
