JUVENILE JUSTICE REFORM

My role on the Juvenile Justice Policy and Oversight Committee is among my most important responsibilities. It is a harsh reality that some children enter the criminal system, however I believe in the continued work of the JJPOC to improve the system for all those involved.

- Requires law enforcement agencies to refer certain offenders to a juvenile review board to receive services
- Establishes an implementation team to develop a mandatory prearrest diversion plan for low-risk youth
- Expands JJPOC's membership by adding two people under age 26 & a community member with relevant experience
- Prohibits police officers from engaging in racial profiling unless in pursuit of a specific person

OUR BIPARTISAN BUDGET INCLUDES

- \$600 million middle class tax cut
- Increase Earned Income Tax Credit for lower income workers
- Expand cuts to retirement savings to benefit seniors

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MORE FUNDING FOR NEW LONDON

HONORING OUR SERVICE MEMBERS

As house chair of the Veterans and Military Affairs Committee, I am committed to delivering reliable assistance for our active and veteran service members. New London is home to a vibrant military community, and I remain committed to honoring their service.

- Granted free graduate tuition to eligible veterans and their families, as well as active members of the National Guard
- Expanded licensing requirements for childcare providers who serve military families
- Expanded eligibility of state services to members of the Space Force





PROTECTING RENTERS

- Increased municipal fines for rental property violations to \$2,000
- Required landlords to offer walk throughs prior to signing a lease
- Capped rental application fees at \$50
- Erased judicial records for renters who win eviction cases
- Required a more timely return of security deposits
- Capped late charges for past due rent

ENVIRONMENTAL MINDFULNESS

- Banned hand-harvesting of horseshoe crabs
- Responded to the municipal solid waste crisis with new funding for facilities & mandatory food scraps diversion at colleges, hospitals, & nursing homes
- Provided additional funding to towns to deal with harmful chemicals like PFAS
- Expanded eligibility for Microgrid and Resilience Loans – allowing the state to build more green buildings

INVESTING IN HEALTHCARE

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- Allowed lifesaving opioid antagonists to be sold through regulated vending machines
- Increased telehealth options for issues like medical marijuana prescriptions & follow-up visits
- Expanded HIV treatment programs to include preventative care
- Improved Drug Discount Card Program
- Assisted licensed nurses with student loans through state-backed loan refinancing rates
