### What Is Coronavirus/COVID-19?

COVID-19 (Coronavirus Disease 2019) is a respiratory illness spread from person to person contact. Symptoms may include cough, fever, and difficulty breathing and may appear 2-14 days after exposure.



Think you have COVID-19? Visit CDC.gov for a list of symptoms.

If you think you need to be tested for coronavirus, consult your doctor. At this time, you cannot receive a test without a doctor's prescription. The state is working with our hospitals to establish testing sites. To find a site, call 2-1-1, the New Haven Health Department at 203-946-6999 or visit www.ynhhs.org/patient-care/covid-19/covid-19-testing. Also feel free to use our own local Fair Haven Health Clinic as a resource by calling 203-777-7411 or visiting www.fhchc.org/coronavirus.

HUSKY members can receive medical and behavioral health services from their health care providers by audio-only telephone or video conferencing.



Dial 2-1-1 and press #3 then #4 if you are in a housing emergency.

Participating financial institutions are now offering mortgage-payment forbearances of up to 90 days, allowing homeowners to reduce or delay mortgage payments. The Governor has also prohibited eviction notices for non-payment of rent until July 1st and granted a 60-day grace period for April and May rent. Municipalities are also being asked to enact options for providing temporary property tax forbearance with reduced interest on delinquent tax payments or extensions.

Visit ct.dol.state.us to access an FAQ sheet on the rights of employees and employers as well as the form to file for unemployment. With the CARES Act passed by Congress, the new Pandemic Unemployment Insurance becoming available includes an extra \$600 per week and also makes those who are self employed, independent contractors and Gig economy workers eligible. The assistance also includes a 13 week extension for those who exhaust their regular 26 weeks of benefits.

The DRS has extended filing and payment deadlines for personal income tax returns to July 15, 2020. This includes quarterly estimated income tax payments. There are also extensions for sales and use tax payments made by businesses for March and April until May 31st.
