Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Connecticut started its vaccine rollout with our first doses going to health care workers and at-risk populations like residents of nursing homes under Phase 1A. More recently the vaccine registration has opened up to those 65 and older under Phase 1B. Vaccine eligibility will expand to the 55-64 age group beginning on March 1 and dedicated clinics for educators and childcare providers will also begin in March.

An age-based schedule of eligibility has been set over the next couple of months for when people will be eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine.

- March 1, 2021: Eligibility expands to age group 55 to 64
- March 22, 2021: Eligibility expands to age group 45 to 54
- April 12, 2021: Eligibility expands to age group 35 to 44
- May 3, 2021: Eligibility expands to age group 16 to 34

To further ensure equitable allocation, DPH will also set targets and work to administer the vaccine to the highestrisk populations.
