

Restructure state government and reduce the number of agencies from 81 down to 57

Concessions from state unions and workers (check any)

Extend the wage freeze for another two years

Increase medical premiums for active and retired employees by \$350

Reduce public school and university grant funding

Cut funding to the state university system and community/technical schools

Reduce funding for health centers and hospitals that treat underinsured patients

Reduce Medicaid benefits and add copayments

Give the Office of the Comptroller the authority to make bulk prescription purchases

Elimination of the Property Tax credit

Increase the Sales Tax base rate to 6.35%

Adopt a 2% surcharge on rental cars

Remove the tax exemption on clothing and footwear priced below \$50

Reduce the Estate Tax exemption threshold from \$3.5 million to \$2.0 million

Increase the tax on alcoholic beverages

Increase the tax on cigarettes and other tobacco products

Adopt a 3% surcharge on luxury goods, like expensive cars, jewelry or boats

Increase the Hotel Occupancy Tax from 12% to 14%

Phase in an Income Tax increase, starting with slight increases on single filers making over \$50,000 and larger increases on incomes exceeding several hundred thousand dollars
