- **Dollars for Day Kimball** – We restored **\$4.4 million** of the Governor’s cuts to Day Kimball Hospital.
- **\$1 Million for downtown Danielson** – The grant will fund intersection improvements, resurfacing, streetlights, property acquisition and relocation and façade improvements in Danielson’s Main Street business district.



SUPPORTING KILLINGLY STUDENTS

- **\$125,000** in additional state education grants for 2016 and **\$150,000** in state funds for new preschool classes.
- **Improving outcomes for students and reducing special education costs** - I introduced legislation that passed unanimously, to identify whether a developmental screening of a child was completed. Early detection increases opportunities for early intervention, improved outcomes and reduces special education costs.
- **Protected funding for Community Plans for Early Childhood** – These plans address early care and education, mental and physical health and the safety of our young children and families, providing local perspective. They play an important role in coordinating services and programs, sharing resources and bringing additional funding into their communities.
- **Received Children's Champion Award** – From CT Early Childhood Alliance.

INVESTING IN TRANSPORTATION

I heard your voices – The state's long-term vision to upgrade our transportation system looked like it was ignoring northeastern CT. I worked with the Governor's office to include a study of the viability of connecting commuter rail from southeastern CT through northeastern CT with the Providence to Worcester Line as well as Route 6 access to Providence.
