The 2025 legislative session featured big issues like lowering energy bills, childcare, special education, and the state budget and we tackled them all.

Our budget creates a \$300 million trust fund that will help increase the availability and affordability of childcare, and a \$250 check for working families who currently receive the Earned-Income Tax Credit. We devoted hundreds of millions of dollars to special education, and we approved comprehensive energy legislation to reduce electric bills for businesses and families.

Connecticut will be poised to continue saving hundreds of millions of dollars annually to continue paying down its hefty pension debt at an accelerated pace."
