ENERGY ASSISTANCE

WINTER HEATING ASSISTANCE BENEFITS

Winter heating assistance pays for most heating sources including natural gas, electricity, oil, propane, kerosene, wood and coal. This program is not just for homeowners; renters are encouraged to apply as well. If you find that you are eligible for winter heating assistance, this means that you may also be eligible for weatherization assistance that will help conserve energy and lower your household heating bills.

ARE YOU A HOMEOWNER OR RENTER WHO PAYS SEPARATELY FOR HEAT?

If you live in a **vulnerable household** (One or more members are age 60 or older, have a disability, or are under age 6) then you may qualify for up to \$585 in winter heating assistance.

If you live in a **non-vulnerable household** (No member is age 60 or over, has a disability, or is under age 6) you may qualify for up to \$535 in winter heating assistance.

The exact level of benefits is based on the number of members in the household, the household’s income, and whether it is a “vulnerable” household. Households with a lower income will be eligible for a higher amount of assistance.

ARE YOUR HEATING COSTS INCLUDED IN YOUR MONTHLY RENT?

You may still be eligible for winter heating assistance up to \$120, depending on the household’s income and number of members.

ADDITIONAL HELP

Most gas and electric utility companies participate in the Winter Protection Program (which helps low income residents avoid shutoffs) and Arrearage Forgiveness Programs. For more information, contact your utility company.

If you or a member of your household is at least 60 years old, under 6 years old or has a disability - including homeowners and renters that pay separately for heat. At this level, renters are not eligible if heat is included in the rent.
