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#### **RELIEF FOR FAMILIES**

- This session we implemented Connecticut's first ever Child Tax Payment, bringing direct relief to residents

### **ENVIRONMENTAL INITIATIVES**

- Expanded eligibility for participation in the state's brownfield remediation program. This will bolster our efforts to help our city address brownfield sites that could be sustainably repurposed
- Expanded financing to develop zero emission vehicle infrastructure, build more solar power and fuel cells, and reinforce our electric grid against the effects of climate change
- Set a goal of reaching zero greenhouse gas emissions from electricity supplied to you by 2040

#### **CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH**

- Created new walk-ins for mental health emergencies
  - Helped school-based health centers develop new mental
  - Expanded licenses to allow for more mental health professionals in the field.
- Funded the expansions of school-based health centers and the services they provide

#### **FUNDING FOR HARTFORD**

- Last year, we invested in the future of Hartford by creating the \$875 million Community Investment Fund (CIF), ensuring a long-term commitment of state bond support for critical projects in our cities.
- In this year's budget we secured:
  - **\$2 million** for a new small business entrepreneurship pilot program to help local businesses in Upper Albany
  - **\$1.1 million** for much needed upgrades to the police substation on the corner of Albany Avenue and Magnolia Street
    - Investment in local landmarks like Elizabeth Park, Keney Park, The Harriet Beecher Stowe House, The Mark Twain House and Knox Urban Garden
  - Lowered the car tax mill rate cap from **45 to 32.46**
