I hope you find this newsletter packed with useful information. It is my pleasure to serve as your state representative.



SERVING THOSE WHO SERVE US

- Guaranteed CT veterans in-state tuition rates

- Allowed pharmacists, in collaboration with your doctor, to adjust more medications without requiring as many inperson visits
- Established a statewide stroke registry
- Made \$12M available for tobacco use prevention and cessation
- Expanded screenings for breast and cervical cancer
- Increased funding to our specialty care hospitals
- Ensured more psychiatric treatment beds
- Created a new home visit pilot program for newborns
- Continued telehealth options
