GROWING OUR ECONOMY

- Expanded the small business loan program in lower-income communities and enabled more out of state businesses to expand into CT.
- Created a fund to improve and manage our small harbors.
- Made it easier for out-of-state nurses and social workers to move to and practice in CT.
- Cut certification red tape to make licensing faster and enable teachers to teach more subjects across more grades.
- Expanded eligibility in fast track educator certification program.
- Supported middle-class and working families by granting most full- and part-time workers access to Paid Sick Days over a three-year period:
 - Use for yourself or to care for a loved one.
 - Up to 40 hours per year.
 - Roll over time to the following year.
- · Established a trade commission with Ireland.

PROTECTING THE ENVIRONMENT

- Banned numerous products containing dangerous PFAS chemicals.
- Required better notice when herbicides are sprayed along railroads.
- Clean Energy Initiatives:
 - Expedited permitting for solar canopies and lifted caps on new solar production.
 - Increased hydropower going to our power grid and extended offshore wind procurement.
- Increased enforcement of boating laws on bodies of water that border our neighboring states.



PROTECTING TAX CUTS

MAKING SENIORS OUR PRIORITY

- Expedited Medicaid coverage for home-based care as an alternative to more costly nursing home care.
- Created a new registry system to connect patients to home care providers and created a dashboard to help navigate nursing home options.
- Required nursing homes and retirement communities to provide at least 60-90 days' notice of any fee increases and improved transparency around fees.
- Created an incentive-based program to improve nursing home care in CT.
- Fast-tracked nursing home transfers and receiverships when homes are closing.
- Strengthened oversight of negligent nursing homes.

SUPPORTING LOCAL SCHOOLS

- Established the Education Mandate Review Advisory Council to review proposed and existing mandates on local Boards of Education.
- Required same day parental notification when a child hurts themself or others.
- Capped the amount of money all districts pay to send kids out of district - saving millions of dollars for local schools.
- Required the State Department of Education to provide school districts an estimate of their next year's funding by the end of the current year, to ensure better budgeting.
- Provided help to classroom paraeducators to pay for their health insurance.
- Improving Childcare:
 - Increased coordination to raise private funds
 - Piloted new childcare programming
 - Expanded the childcare incubator program
