HELPING WITH GROCERY BILLS

The Food Stamp program is now called the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and it is easier for seniors to qualify for SNAP. SNAP helps seniors and families afford the cost of food at grocery stores. Income eligibility requirements were recently raised, meaning a household of two can earn up to \$2,248 monthly and qualify for assistance. www.ct.gov/SNAP | 800.742.6906

ENERGY ASSISTANCE

It is time to start planning for the colder months ahead. Home heating assistance programs have already begun to accept energy applications for the upcoming winter. EXPANDING ACCESS TO AFFORDABLE HOMECARE

New rules expand access to affordable personal care assistance under the Connecticut Homecare Program for Elders. This program can provide assistance with daily living activities and help many seniors remain independent in their homes rather than enter a nursing home.

CONNPACE PLUS

More seniors and people with disabilities are eligible to participate in the federal Medicare Savings Program (MSP) under a new law that effectively extends the program to people with incomes as high as the ConnPACE limits (\$25,100 for individuals and \$33,800 for married couples in 2009). The Department of Social Services pays for MSP participants' Medicare Part A or Part B premiums, or both. And qualifying for MSP also qualifies people for another federal program that pays some or all of their Medicare Part D drug benefit premium and any Part D "doughnut hole" charges. Participants also pay lower co-payments for each prescription.
