

2025 SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

\$93 MILLION IN FUNDING FOR MERIDEN

- \$1.9 million in Community Investment Funding to improve Columbus Park and the Linear Trails.
- \$250,000 grant awarded for the planning phase of the Meriden Health Department.
- \$83 million in Education Cost Sharing (ECS) funding for Meriden schools – a \$4 million increase from last year.

INVESTING IN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

- Established the foundation for an early childhood education Endowment to ensure every family has access to affordable, high-quality childcare.
- Free childcare for families earning up to \$100,000, with cost caps for families earning more.
- Endowment funded through budget surplus, allowing for long-term sustainability while continuing to support the Rainy Day Fund and reduce pension debt.
