

Creating Jobs – My #1 Priority

We implemented many job creating measures this session, including:

- » Encouraging businesses to create jobs by providing tax incentives through the “First Five” program
- » Expanding our reinvestments in manufacturing
- » Provide student loan reimbursements for “green-tech” degree holders after two years employment in the field
- » Creating the Connecticut Airport Authority to run our airports as economic engines for the economy
- » Saving our Vo-tech schools that teach the skills that put people to work.

Saluting Our Veterans

Providing a better life to those who protect us

Veterans, along with their families, have sacrificed so much so we can enjoy our freedom and a democratic way of life. Veterans returning from foreign engagements need to know that we appreciate what they do for us and that means passing legislation that helps them and their families.

Veterans’ bills passed this session:

- » Offer veterans’ license plates to a member of the U. S. armed forces or his or her surviving spouse.
- » Allow veteran status to be on a driver’s license or identity card.
- » Provide disabled wartime veterans with free parking, admission, and boat access parking to state recreational areas.
- » Expand the waiver of property tax interest for certain armed forces members in Iraq and Afghanistan.
- » Waive the \$20 fee for one certified copy of a veteran’s death certificate when requested by family.
- » Create a one-stop website for services available for veterans.

Meeting Children's Special Needs

Children who require special education services will now receive them sooner. School districts must now perform evaluations within 60 days whenever it is suspected that a child requires special education services.

Getting Tough on School Bullying

In response to growing concerns over increasing acts of school bullying, we passed legislation that strengthens school bullying laws and requires all school employees to complete annual training programs dealing with the problem.

The bill makes the school principal responsible to investigate and address bullying and electronic cyber-bullying whether it occurs in or out-of-school.
