

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

HEALTH

- Made it easier for people on copay-only health plans to access body scans, physicals and occupational therapy (PA 24-81)
- Cut red tape for operating plasma donation centers (PA 24-7)

DISABLED ACCESS

 Introduced and led passage and enactment of wheelchair repair bill; expediting and simplifying wheelchair repair process (PA 24-58)

SCHOOLS

- Established the Education Mandate Review Advisory Council to review proposed and existing mandates on local boards of education (PA 24-45)
- Capped the amount of money all districts pay to send kids out of district saving millions of dollars for local schools (PA 24081)


PROTECTING TAX CUTS

MAKING SENIORS A PRIORITY
