BIG WINS FOR HAMDEN


- Created the option for Hamden to purchase High Meadows from the state

- Made it easier to cancel a subscription over the phone

MAKING HAMDEN SUSTAINABLE

This session, after 4 years of work, the legislature passed new regulations that make it easier to clean up polluted properties. This is a win for Hamden because it will allow the clean up of properties like Six Lakes and return them to the community.

HOUSING AND ENDING HOMELESSNESS

- Established the End Homelessness Caucus to explore policies to address the complex factors contributing to homelessness
- Secured \$13.5 million for homeless services and \$6.7 million for the Rental Assistance Program (RAP)
- Established an Interagency Council on Homelessness to address and prevent homelessness in CT









WORKERS

- Expanded the program formerly known as MyCTSavings by including Personal Care Attendants (PCA's), allowing workers in a notoriously low-paying industry to have access to a state administered retirement plan utilizing Roth IRA's
- Expanded our landmark Paid Family and Medical Leave Insurance Program to cover non-certified school employees, such as secretaries, nurses, custodians, security officers, and paraeducators
- Expanded coverage under the Firefighters Cancer Relief Program to include skin cancer

TOWING

We passed legislation updating the archaic laws on towing. Here's what that means:

- Additional requirements and restrictions for towing from private property
- Allows people to redeem their personal property without paying the towing or storage fees
- Towing companies must accept credit and debit cards and make change for cash
- Requires the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to develop a towing bill of rights
- Extends the minimum time that garage owners must hold a vehicle before they can sell it, from 30 to 60 days
- Allows towns to regulate nonconsensual towing and parking facility management in a manner consistent with state law
