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

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2022 SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

- Addressing Children's Mental Health Needs
- Cutting Taxes to Combat Historic Inflation
- Keeping CT Safe with Juvenile Justice Reform

STANDING UP FOR WORKERS

- Toughened the penalty for public contractors who underpay or withhold wages and benefits, created a public registry of those individuals, and established a process for revoking the licenses of repeat offenders.
- Protected the rights of employees against being required to attend meetings solely on the employer's religious or political views
- Expanded access to special relief funding for specific front-line workers who had to work during COVID and got sick as a result.
- Helped certain front-line essential employees from the private sector access premium pay if they had worked through the pandemic.

CUT YOUR TA SES

\$650 MILLION IN TAX RELIEF

- Creates a Child Tax Credit
- Cuts property taxes for retirees
- Cuts the car tax
- Extends the gas tax cut
- Extends free bus service
- Ends pension and annuity tax
- Invests in healthcare workers



IMPROVING ACCESS TO QUALITY HEALTH CARE

- Allowed pharmacists, in collaboration with doctors, to adjust more medications without requiring as many in-person visits.
- Established a statewide stroke registry.
- Strengthened the state's intervention and response to lead poisoning and prevention.
- Increased funding for The Hospital for Special Care, which
 does not get the same schedule of state support as our
 general hospitals.
- Expanded screenings for breast and cervical cancer.
- Ensured more psychiatric treatment beds.
- · Continued telehealth options.



MAKING CONNECTICUT MORE EQUITABLE

- Required towns with over 25,000 residents to establish
 a local fair rent commission to respond to tenant
 complaints about excessive rent increases and landlords
 not abiding by the housing code.
- Increased health care coverage to undocumented immigrant children, up to age 12.
- Honored our commitment to body cameras, police accountability and our new Clean Slate laws.
- Increased business development funding for minorityowned businesses.
- Expanded minority teacher scholarships.
- Invested in affordable housing.
- Doubled funding for bilingual education.
- Required most publicly owned facilities to provide free menstrual products.
