Reducing Car Break-ins and Thefts

I have previously mentioned my work on reducing car break-ins and thefts in our community. I'm pleased to report that two bills have passed that help address this critical issue.

The first is SB 1093 which:

- Makes it a crime to entice a minor into committing a crime. We've heard that some adults may be recruiting minors to steal cars for them. This law takes a clear stand against this abhorrent behavior.
- Requires the Judicial Branch to study ways to decrease time between a child's arrest and court appearance, as well as ways to reduce juvenile recidivism. In reducing juvenile crime, it is essential to make sure minors face consequences, or are given the necessary services, as soon as possible. Unfortunately, the justice system is not working quickly enough today.

We also passed HB 6505, to help provide additional tools for law enforcement to stop repeat juvenile offenders in order to keep our communities safe.

• This legislation will collect data from the Judicial Branch on all juvenile detainment requests from the police and report this data to the General Assembly. This aims to improve the detainment process and ensure it is working properly to keep the community safer from crime

Expanding Telehealth

Throughout the pandemic, the state issued emergency orders to expand telehealth services. This offered significant relief to our most vulnerable residents and allowed flexibility for patients and providers. Recently, I was proud to support HB 6470 to maintain this impactful access to health care services and extend access to HUSKY Health participants.

Making Voting Easier

Voting is the foundation of democracy, but Connecticut's outdated and restrictive voting laws have left too many behind. Early voting offers a safe, flexible and convenient way to vote. I was proud to vote for HJ 59, which is the first step towards a constitutional question on allowing in-person early voting appearing on the 2022 general election ballot. I was also proud to vote for HB 6205 which updates the language in existing statutes to allow voters to more easily access absentee ballots. I believe these measures will catch us up to many other states that have had these options for years.
