At the end of each session, I send this informational guide summarizing some of the work that we did at the state Capitol this year. The themes were focused on investing in our economy as we move out of the pandemic, cutting taxes, and addressing the mental health needs of our state.

Our workforce investments will be felt across all healthcare. manufacturing, and building trades – areas that have been especially hard hit with early retirements. We provided grants and low-interest loans to businesses needing help expanding and hiring more employees. We carefully selected \$650 million in new tax cuts while paying down our pension debt by over \$5.5 billion over the past two years. All while making sure Rocky Hill, Wethersfield, and Newington had increased funding in place for schools, mental health, and safety programs. This was all done with a balanced budget and coming in under our spending cap.
