His advice to all GED students and students not currently enrolled in high school completion classes is that, "There is no good job without a diploma. I appreciate all the help my instructors gave me at East Hartford. It's a big achievement for me to have this diploma." East Hartford's GED program's registration is currently closed for the spring, but interested students should call the office to inquire about the National External Diploma Program or the Credit Diploma Program. Our New Location

East Hartford Adult & Continuing Education started classes at the Early Childhood Learning Center (ECLC) at Hockanum School in October 2016. This is our third location and joins East Hartford High School and New Covenant United Methodist Church in providing Adult Education classes. The goal of this location is to meet multigenerational, educational needs. ECLC parents enjoy the convenience of being able to drop their children off at ECLC, then walk down the hallway to an adult education class in English as a Second Language (ESL) or General Education Development (GED). ESL classes are held daily from 9-11 a.m. and GED classes run daily from noon-2 p.m.

Mentoring Program

According to the research, one of the best ways to keep adult education students enrolled in classes is mentoring. Each student enrolled in the Credit Diploma Program (CDP) has had a mentor assigned to him or her. A mentor's role is to check in with each student at least weekly and to discuss attendance, academics, and issues such as transportation and childcare that might affect a student's ability to succeed in our program. Students enrolled in General Educational Development (GED) classes who are 25 and younger, have also been assigned a mentor. This is the pilot year for the program, but if the program sees a positive change in student outcomes, it may be expanded.
