I am proud to share some highlights from the historic 2022 legislative session. It was historic most notably for the \$650 million in tax cuts – likely the largest single year tax cuts in state history. We also made huge investments in education, mental health initiatives, public safety, and our environment – all while honoring the spending cap, paying off billions in pension debt, and continuing to keep our rainy day fund at record levels.

Personally, I worked hard on the Judiciary Committee, the Finance Revenue and Bonding Committee, and as the House Chair of legislature's Banking Committee. I am particularly proud of a historic bill we passed out of the Banking Committee to eliminate excessive overdraft fees and other charges on bank accounts (PA 22-77). All in all, it was a very successful legislative session.

That's not to say we aren't facing challenges. We are seeing inflation that hits everyone's wallets and housing prices that are pricing many out of even modest homes. That's why I fought hard to provide you with relief: increasing the property tax credit, phasing out taxes on retirement income, creating a childcare rebate, cutting the gas tax and more.

- We passed the strongest law in the nation protecting reproductive rights. It protects medical privacy by preventing the disclosure of medical information related to reproductive healthcare and protects individuals from extradition to other states for seeking, providing, or assisting others in obtaining reproductive healthcare that is legal in Connecticut. - We passed a series of bills to support children's mental health and wellbeing by increasing access to mental health care programs and providers, including increased funding to schools to expand mental health staff and access to care. (PA 22-47, PA 22-80, PA 22-81)
- Made \$12M available for tobacco prevention and cessation. (PA 22-118)
- Strengthened the state's intervention and response to lead poisoning and prevention. (PA 22-49)
- Expanded screenings for breast and cervical cancer. (PA 22-90)
- Expanded access to telehealth options. (PA 22-118)

PROTECTING THE ENVIRONMENT

- Secured one-time childcare rebate of \$250 per child, up to three children.
- Capped car taxes at 32.46 mills.
- Cut state gas tax to zero through December 1, 2022.
- Secured millions in state funding for Manchester and Glastonbury including funding for Manchester High School's manufacturing apprenticeship program.
