I am proud to share some highlights from the 2022 legislative session.

The rapid rise of inflation coincided with a historic budget surplus and rainy day fund, allowing the legislature to provide you some relief by cutting \$650 million in taxes - including the first-ever Child Tax Credit of \$250 per child, increasing the property tax credit, cutting the gas tax, and ending pension and annuity income from the income tax. While there is more to do to ease the pain the country and the rest of the world is feeling, these cuts are a significant first step in making Connecticut more affordable for middle class families and senior residents.

But that wasn't all we did. I was proud to co-author a best-inthe-nation approach to Children's Mental Health, helping our kids navigate the future and work to ensure their safety in our schools and at home. We further protected healthcare rights for women, passed laws to combat neighborhood crime, and helped businesses succeed by reducing costs and bolstering the educationto-work pipeline.

LEADING THE WAY ON CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH

This year, I was proud to be a lead author of the most comprehensive legislation on Children's Mental Health in decades. For a full list of changes and successes, visit my webpage, but here is a partial look at how we're supporting our children now and in the future:

Funding a new Intensive Outpatient Program for the district in a partnership with Wheeler Clinic, serving children with depression, anxiety, self-harm, substance abuse and more; opening immediately.

Expanding Access: Created grant programs to hire school mental health professionals and programs; eliminated prior authorization for in-patient stays; added in-patient beds at Connecticut Children's; created funds to cover medications and in-home treatments.

Bringing Doctors to CT: Created Psychiatrist Recruitment and Retention Fund, Student Loan Reimbursement for Psychiatric Providers, License reciprocity with other states, and expanded Telehealth availability.

Early Mental Health Intervention: Creates a Mental Health Screening Tool for use by pediatricians at yearly visits and in EDs; provides Adolescent Mental Health Continuing Education for every pediatrician in CT; funds 211 Emergency Mobile Psychiatric Service for 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and paves the way for nationwide suicide hotline (9-8-8) access.

FOCUSED ON SCHOOL SAFETY

Created and funded Trauma Coordinator positions for all CT public schools to help identify and treat students who are at-risk for violent behavior, hopefully averting possible tragedies.

Funded NARCAN in every school who wants it.

Developed a statewide Peer-to-Peer support program for mental health, which will help kids speak up when they suspect possible school danger.

Our updated Red Flag Law allows family members and mental health professionals to seek a Risk Protection Order, which if approved by a judge, will remove weapons and ammunition from the home. The law also removes the current one-year maximum seizure, while adding more opportunities for continual due process.



TACKLING CRIME

- Made it harder to resell catalytic converters.
- Passed an historic overhaul of juvenile justice laws, which
 provides for earlier interventions and tougher penalties with
 repeat offenders who commit serious crimes while investing
 millions in diversionary programs, Youth Service Bureaus, and
 Juvenile Review Boards.
- Funded state and local task forces to address gun violence and auto thefts.
- Passed domestic violence and sexual abuse awareness and prevention initiatives.

HELPING BUSINESSES SUCCEED

- **Lowered** the business **tax rate** for unemployment insurance, effectively paying the federal loan repayment for the coming year.
- Established **JobsCT** program helping companies in target industries earn **rebates** against insurance premiums and state taxes for meeting job targets.
- Offered support to CT residents with CDL training.
- Helped community providers keep up with inflation.
- Approved economic incentives tied to new federal contracts and expansion, supporting the aerospace manufacturing pipeline in our district.

SUPPORTING OUR SENIORS

- **Eliminated pension and annuity taxes** for retirees making less than \$100k/year.
- **Enhance services** in nursing homes by requiring any new proposed nursing facilities to incorporate person-centered care.
- Expanded access to long-term care.
- Require mandated **elder abuse** reporters to complete elder abuse training within 90 days of becoming an elder abuse reporter.
- Reduced the mandatory reporting deadline for suspected elder abuse from 72 hours to 32 hours.
