The 2025 legislative session featured big issues like lowering energy bills, childcare, special education and the state budget - and we tackled them all.

This session, I was proud to be appointed to the leadership position of **Deputy Speaker** and **Caucus Co-Chair**, which gives me more of an ability to advocate for important priorities for our district and our state. I'm proud to provide constituents with in-district learning events on topics such as legal protections for kids heading to college, safe driving and pedestrian safety, as well as **healthcare workshops** and avoiding the most **current consumer**

The budget funded grants for our towns' education budgets and municipal aid to reduce your local property tax burden. We also did it responsibly, while still maintaining a \$1.58 billion surplus, a maxed-out Rainy Day Fund, and a **Special Transportation Fund** to protect CT from draconian federal cuts made without rhyme or reason - something we will likely address in a special session this fall.

BIG WINS FOR CHESHIRE WALLINGFORD AND HAMDEN

- Increased state funding for Cheshire's new schools, saving Cheshire taxpayers an additional \$22.4 million in property taxes for our new and upgraded schools
- Increased **Hamden's** municipal funding to a **record amount** in 2025 and 2026
- Wallingford will receive an additional \$454,450 in total Special Education aid for FY 26 and FY 27
- Increased Education Funding to the entire district by \$4.1 million, including a total \$108.8 million in Town Aid for FY 26, so you can **pay less** in your property taxes

MAKING CONNECTICUT MORE AFFORDABLE FOR FAMILIES

FREE CHILDCARE, COLLEGE SAVINGS AND A CHILD TAX CREDIT

- By 2027, families earning up to \$100,000 will receive free state-funded childcare
- Families earning above \$100,000 will pay **no more than 7%** of their income
- Launched a tax credit to incentivize employers to contribute to employees' college savings accounts
- Expanded access to **MYCTSavings**, the state administered retirement program for all workers who enroll

NEW SPECIAL EDUCATION FUNDING

To **help our kids** and **reduce your property taxes** we approved the following **Special Education Funding**:

- **\$221 million** in annual reimbursements for special education
- \$30 million annually for new special education expansion and development grants
- **\$20 million** in competitive grants for in-district programming and capital school construction projects

Plus Continued **Education Support** includes:

 Funded chronic absenteeism intervention programs, highdosage tutoring; supported dual-credit assistance for high school students

LOWERING ELECTRIC BILLS

This session, I introduced legislation to force a state takeover of Eversource and UI, sell off their out-of-state holdings to invest in Connecticut's grid, and make energy affordable for all by making the utility a not-for-profit entity. Legislation like this takes time to come to fruition, but my colleagues and I will continue to fight for this enormous change, to make electricity affordable for all residents.

In the meantime, we passed legislation which:

- Caps program costs that utility companies charge you, while profiting from the interest!
- Uses state financing to pay down COVID-era back payments and storm-related costs

MAKING HEALTHCARE EASIER AND MORE AFFORDABLE

- Established the nation's first cap on generic drug prices
- Stopped pharmacy middlemen from passing along cost increases for profit
- Expanded **CT Paid Family Medical Leave** to municipal and non-certified school employees
- **Guaranteed Rx rebates go to YOU**, the consumer, <u>not</u> corporate middlemen

PROTECTING CONSUMERS

I'm working diligently on the first-ever state No Solicitation
List, to protect you and your home from unwanted salespeople,
scammers, and crooks. I'm close to final language and hope to put
this in to place next year! This year, we:

- **Protected consumers** from surprise subscription renewals and hidden fees, and predatory payday loans
- Passed a law I wrote to protect children with stricter laws on minors and peer-to-peer money apps like Cash App and Venmo, thanks to a Cheshire resident sharing their family's story with me. These apps are a tool for abusers, child traffickers, drug dealers, and scammers







KEEPING OUR COMMUNITIES SAFE

I am working closely with Animal Control Officers from across the state to develop better standardized training, mutual aid across towns, protect ACO officers during domestic calls, and codifying into law a lifetime ban on ACOs who are found guilty of animal abuse, on or off the job. Additionally, we:

Expanded the **Fallen Officer Fund** to support families of **firefighters**, **EMTs**, **and paramedics**

 Extended the work zone speed camera program statewide

killed in the line of duty

- Strengthened penalties for reckless driving and illegal street racing
- Enhanced **protections for victims** of domestic violence and sexual assault
- Launched a working group to review benefits and protections for first responders, including dispatchers and DPW staff



SMARTER DEVELOPMENT

- Passed legislation I wrote which requires any developer submitting a study to support a local development project to include a statement of financial interest, so our Planning and Zoning Commissions can refuse to accept the study if it is biased and paid for by anyone with a financial interest. This was written based on the Mountain Road Project in Cheshire.
- Secured new planning tools for towns to support resilient infrastructure and **smart growth**

SUPPORTING OUR SENIORS

- Ensured **insurance coverage** for biomarker testing to **detect cancer** early
- Closed a loophole to require background checks for all longterm care facility employees
- Required greater consideration of family proximity when nursing homes attempt to transfer patients

SALUTING OUR VETERANS

- Protected military pensions from being counted against Medicaid and other support programs
- Waived hidden college fees and continued National Guard enlistment incentives
- Created town-level options to expand property tax relief for veterans and Gold Star families
- Added six new Veterans Service Officers to tackle benefit backlogs
