# **EQUITABLE APPROACH TO TAXES**

- Established an Enhanced Tax Credit for Families: For the first time, we've created a refundable tax credit of \$250 per filer through the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) framework helping working families keep more of what they earned.
- **Supported Childcare Providers:** We created a \$500 refundable tax credit for home daycare owners recognizing and sustaining the vital care workforce that allows families to work.
- Made Corporate Taxes Fairer and More Equitable: We closed a major loophole for big multi-state corporations by ending a tax break that kept them from paying their share of taxes, which gave them a competitive advantage over our local businesses. We removed a rule that limited how much tax big corporate groups had to pay when filing together now they pay what they actually owe.

# **SUPPORTING CHILDREN AND FAMILIES**

#### **INVESTING IN CHILDCARE**

• We established the Early Childhood Education Endowment - an investable trust fund that will create universal access to childcare starting with a downpayment of nearly \$300 million.

#### FREE/REDUCED COST CHILDCARE

• By 2027, families earning up to \$100,000 will be able to receive childcare at no cost, while families earning more than \$100,000 will pay no more than 7% of their income for childcare.

# MAKING OUR COMMUNITIES STRONGER

- Led reform to make it easier for municipalities to enforce housing code violations.
- Reduced red tape for converting vacant commercial property into housing.



### **WORKING FOR CT'S WORKERS**

- Expanded our landmark Paid Family and Medical Leave Insurance Program to cover non-certified school employees, such as secretaries, nurses, custodians, security officers, and paraeducators.
- Expanded the program formerly known as MyCTSavings by including Personal Care Attendants (PCAs), allowing workers in a notoriously low-paying industry to have access to a state administered retirement plan utilizing Roth IRAs.
